NEW BOOKS – DECEMBER 2021

Anxious People – Fredrik Backman. A group of strangers at an open house are taken hostage by a failed bank robber and become reluctant allies in this mood-booster story.

Assassination Vacation – Sarah Vowell embarks on a roadtrip to U.S. sites of political violence while reporting with her wisecracking humor, honesty and thought-provoking criticism.

The Boys: A Memoir of Hollywood and Family (LP) – Ron and Clint Howard. A memoir of how two famous brothers survived the "child-actor syndrome" due in large part to their Oklahoma-born parents.

The Greatest Tennis Matches of All Time – Steve Flink, author and tennis historian, breaks down, analyzes, and puts into historical context the most memorable matches ever played.

Half-Earth: Our Planet's Fight for Life – Edward O. Wilson. Proposes that to stave off the mass extinction of species, including our own, we must dedicate fully half the Earth's surface to nature.

Harlem Shuffle – Colson Whitehead. As Ray, just a little bit bent, navigates a double life between striver and crook, he begins to see who pulls the strings in 1960s Harlem. Can he avoid getting killed, save his cousin, score his share yet maintain his reputation as home furniture salesman?

Justine – Lawrence Durrell (of Corfu). In Alexandria, Egypt on the Eve of WWII, the obsessed characters' pursuits lead not to museums but the bedroom with each seeking to know-and-possess the other.

Old Age: Journey into Simplicity – Helen M. Luke reflects on final journeys described in great literature and elucidates the difference between growing old and disintegrating. She encourages the reader to grow emotionally and mentally.

Running with Sherman: the donkey with the heart of a hero (LP) – Christopher McDougall. A heartwarming story about training a rescue donkey to run one of the most challenging races in America. Full of heart, hijinks, humor.

State of Terror – Hillary Clinton & Louise Penny. Secretary of State Ellen Adams, the political enemy of, yet appointed by, the newly sworn in President, is faced with a high stakes, intricate, international conspiracy by enemies closer than she ever imagined.

Woke Up This Morning: The Definitive Oral History of the Sopranos – Michael Imperioli & Steve Schirripa. This tell-all covers the entire behind-the-scenes history of the Sopranos series from pitch to casting to the cut to black.
