The Engineer's Wife: A Novel of the Brooklyn Bridge (LP) Tracey Wood. Based on the true story of Emily Roebling, wife of the injured Brooklyn Bridge Chief Engineer. Untrained but under his guidance, she assumes his role, despite resistance and overwhelming obstacles.

Hotel on the Corner of Bitter and Sweet (LP) Jamie Ford. A story of age-old conflicts between father and son, the beauty and sadness of what happened to Japanese Americans in WW II Seattle, and the depths and longing of love.

Marie Curie and Her Daughters Shelley Emling draws on personal letters released by Curie's only granddaughter showing how Marie influenced her daughters, Irene and Eve, yet let them blaze their own paths.

The Mystery and Meaning of the Dead Sea Scrolls After decades of controversy surrounding their dissemination and interpretation, Hershel Shanks, editor of Biblical Archaeology Review, provides their religious and historical context.

The Woman Who Smashed Codes: A True Story of Love, Spies, and the Unlikely Heroine Who Outwitted America's Enemies Jason Fagone. The greatest codebreaking duo, an American woman and her husband, invented the modern science of cryptology used to unmask Nazi spies and to help win WW II.

The World According to Fannie Davis: My Mother's Life in Detroit Numbers Bridgett Davis. An homage to her mother who ran numbers for 34 years, doing what it took to survive in a legitimate business that just happened to be illegal.
