NEW BOOKS – JUNE 2021

100 Years of the Best American Short Stories – Lorrie Moore.

Atlantic Fever: Lindbergh, His Competitors, and the Race to Cross the Atlantic – Joe Jackson delves into the 14 lives of the big-name and forgotten competitors for the \$25,000 prize for crossing the Atlantic without stopping.

The Code Breaker: Jennifer Doudna, Gene Editing, and the Future of the Human Race – Walter Isaacson. How the Nobel Prize winner and her colleagues invented CRISPR thus launched a revolution that will allow us to cure diseases, fend off viruses, and have healthier babies.

Dad Jokes: Over 600 of the Best (Worst) Dad Jokes Around - Jimmy Niro.

Craig & Fred: A Marine, a Stray Dog, and How They Saved Each Other (LP) - Craig Grossi. The true story of a US Marine, the stray dog he met on an Afghan battlefield, and how they saved each other.

The Dreaming Suburb: 1919-1940, V.1 of 2 – The Avenue Book - R.F. Delderfield. The everyday lives of 4 English families between WW I & II as their hopes, dreams, and struggles play out against a radically changing world.

The Eighty-Dollar Champion: Snowman, the Horse that Inspired a Nation - Elizabeth Letts. Dutch immigrant de Layer saved Snowman from the slaughter house and the pair climbed to the very top of the show jumping sport.

Elon Musk: Tesla, SpaceX, and the Quest for a Fantastic Future - Ashlee Vance. From Musk's tumultuous upbringing in S. Africa and flight to the U. S. to his technical innovations and entrepreneurial pursuits. Explores if the nation can still compete in an age of fierce global competition.

London: The Novel - Edward Rutherfurd. A saga of ever-shifting fortunes, fates, and intrigues of six families from the age of Julius Caesar to the 20th C.

Mary Rose – Geoffrey Girard's modern take on a classic ghost story originally written by J. M. Barrie. For years Alfred Hitchcock attempted a film adaptation.

The Mysterious Affair at Styles: Hurcule Poirot Mysteries #1 (LP) - Agatha Christie. Christie introduces the Belgian refugee of the Great War, Poirot, who puts his prodigious sleuthing skills to work.

The Pillars of the Earth – Ken Follett. A twelfth-century historical epic of the building of a mighty Gothic cathedral. An Oprah Book Club selection.

The Queen's Gambit: A **Novel** - Walter Tevis. From orphan to a young woman's journey through the worlds of chess and drug addiction. A Netflix hit.

Roses: A **Novel** – Leila Meacham. Two E.Texas families must deal with the aftermath of a marriage that never happened leading to deceit, secrets, and tragedies in a multigenerational Southern saga echoing *Gone with the Wind*.
