American Harvest: God, Country, and Farming in the Heartland by Marie Mockett, a city gal, who returns to the family farm she inherited. An epic story of the American wheat harvest, the politics of food, and the culture of the Great Plains.

The Big Finish - Brooke Fossey. An unflinching look at growing old in a senior living community as told by a wise-cracking man who didn't see any of it coming. Funny, insightful, and life-affirming.

Going to the Mountain: Life Lessons I Learned From My Grandfather, Nelson Mandela - Ndaba Mandela et al. Ndaba, born in Soweto, was taken in when 11 and raised by his granddad who he'd met only once. They slowly, cautiously built a relationship that would affect both their lives in extraordinary ways.

A Good Provider Is One Who Leaves Home: One Family and Migration in the **21st Century** - Jason DeParle, veteran journalist, chronicles our new age of global migration told through the multi-generational saga of a Filipino family.

On Gold Mountain – Lisa See. Chronicles the one-hundred-year odyssey of her Chinese- American family beginning with her great-great-grandfather in 1869.

Our Souls at Night – Kent Haruf. A spare yet eloquent, bittersweet yet inspiring story of a widow and widower who, in advanced age, come together to wrestle with the events of their lives and their hopes for the imminent future.

The Ungrateful Refugee: What the Immigrants Never Tell You – Dina Nayeri weaves her personal story of escape from Iran at age eight with the human stories of others forced to flee home to journey across borders in hope of starting afresh.
