#### **NEW BOOKS – JUNE 2022**

Aimless Love: New and Selected Poems by Billy Collins.

Chicken Soup for the Soul: My Very Good, Very Bad Cat by Amy Newmark.

**The Elephant of Belfast** by S. Kirk Walsh. Inspired by true events, the story of a young woman zookeeper who must protect a newly arrived orphan Indian elephant during the WWII blitz of Belfast, Ireland and the growing dependence upon each other for survival and solace.

**Following Atticus** by Tom Ryan. A middle-aged, overweight, no-nonsense journalist sold his newspaper to raise money in memory of a friend by climbing 48 NH mountains twice during the winter with Atticus M. Finch, his Miniature Schnauzer. Adventures await the pair.

**Lost Roses** by Martha Kelly. New Yorker Eliza and her old Paris friend Sofya, a cousin of the Romanovs, travel to St. Petersburg on holiday. With the outbreak of WWI, Eliza escapes back to New York while Sofya and her family flee to their country estate where danger awaits and soon letters from Sofya stop coming.

**The Newcomer** by Mary Kay Andrews. When Letty's sister is murdered she follows a clue that takes her and niece Maya to the Murmuring Surf Motel where a flock of retirees and snowbirds regard her with suspicion and she must avoid the owner's detective son.

**The Return: Fathers, Sons, and the Land in Between** by Hisham Matar. Pulitzer Prize winning memoir of a young man in England whose father in Libya disappeared under mysterious circumstances and the son's return 22 years later in search of the truth.

**Run, Rose, Run** by Dolly Parton and James Patterson. A thriller about a young singer-songwriter on the rise and on the run.

**The Seventh Flag** by Sid Balman. Four generations of two farming families formed an unlikely bond in small town West Texas, where six nation or state flags have flown. An iconic American family and a Syrian Muslim (great-grandfather part of the U.S. Camel Corps) live in partnership under a seventh flag flying over a mosaic community.

**Wintering** by Peter Geye. Sick and elderly, Harry disappears into the winter Minnesota wilderness. Son, Gustav, relates an adventure story of 30 years earlier when, at the age of 18, he accompanied Harry, escaping a marriage, into the winter woods.

**Where you Come From** by Sasa Stanisic. In 1992 a boy and his mother flee the war in Yugoslavia and arrive in Germany where they are joined six months later by the father bringing a brown suitcase, insomnia, and a scar. The story of an uprooted family remade by war. Blends autofiction, fable, and choose-your-own-adventure.
